



I deem it a great privilege to forward this report and place it at the Lotus feet of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba for the year 2021.

The year 2020-21 was in all respects a very dismal year in view of the COVID pandemic sweeping across our country and the world. This has curtailed the normal movements of people from one place to another.

For any long distance journey we have to take passes from Police Departments to reach Puttaparthy. In spite of this Sri Sathya Sai Sevadal members rallied in good numbers for various service activities in Puttaparthy. It was only Swamy's Blessings and Love that enabled them to do this great Seva in Puttaparthy.

While we could not conduct the medical clinics and Mega medical camps, all our organizations

to the occasion providing Food packets every day for about two months. With the coordination of Police department the Food prepared by sevadal for distribution to thousands of migrant labour, sick people and attendants in tha hospitals. In spite of severe restrictions of movements the sevadal devotees were able to mobilize all the provisions for preparing food packets in time.

Another great initiative launched by the state organization was the **TELE MEDICINE** concept, which linked the patient to the doctor even from the remote rural areas. In the absence of regular medical clinics the Telemedicine concept became very popular & thousands of patients availed this facility & could get medical advice from various specialty doctors for their ailments.

In Hyderabad and all the districts in Telangana food packets were distributed liberally in those months. In addition we also distributed full provisions for several thousands of families whose maintenance and livelihood was affected because of the lockdown.

The Seva dal also did great work in the Tribal areas of Telangana districts with the help of the concerned Government Departments and could provide essential food items, clothes and medicines to interior tribal villages.

I am happy to note that the State President, all the District Presidents and Convenors did great job during difficult times in promoting various service activities to reach the needy in both rural and urban areas of Telangana State. I pray Swamy's blessings on all of them.

About the Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisation

Preamble

The Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations, founded by Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba in the year 1965, is a service organisation with a spiritual core and base to benefit all mankind irrespective of religion, caste, creed or sect. The Organisation serves as a platform for its members to undertake service and other activities as their sadhana (spiritual discipline) which is motivated by an urge for self-transformation to realise one's inherent divinity.

Objectives

The following extracts from the discourses given by Sri Sathya Sai Baba proclaim the purpose of the organisation:

"You must have the firm belief that the aim of this Organisation is to remove the obstacles that keep man away from God, that separate maanavathwa (humanity) from Maadhavathwa (Divinity). There can be no human; it is all Divine. This Organisation must elevate the human into the Divine."

— Divine Discourse, All-India Conference, Prashanthi Nilayam, 21 November 1970

"The main objective of the Sathya Sai Organisation, which you must always keep before you is to help man to recognise the Divinity that is inherent in him. But, this Divinity is latent; it is veiled; it is not always apparent to oneself or others."

— Divine Discourse, Bombay, 6 January 1975

In a revealing discourse delivered on the 23rd of February 1968 in Prashanthi Nilayam, Sri Sathya Sai Baba clearly explained the purpose of the organisation. He said:

"The Organisations named after Me are not to be used for publicising My Name, or creating a new cult around My worship. They must try to spread interest in japam (recitation of God's Name), dhyaanam (meditation) and other saadhanas (spiritual practices), which lead man Godward; they must demonstrate the joy derivable from bhajan (devotional group singing) and Naamasmarana (remembering God's Name), the Shaanthi (peace) that one can draw from Sathsang (good company). They must render seva (service) to the helpless, the sick, the distressed, the illiterate and the needy. Their seva (selfless service) should not be exhibitionistic; it must seek no reward, not even gratitude or thanks from the recipients. Seva is saadhana, not a pastime of the rich and well placed. Each one must realise his own truth. That is the purpose of all the teaching, all the curing, all the counselling, all the organising, all the advising that I do"— Prashanthi Nilayam, 23 February 1968

It is emphasized that the Sai Organisation is not a religious or a proselytising organisation. It has also not been established to preach any religion. At no point is an individual asked to follow a certain religion or rituals. On the contrary each is inspired to follow his own faith to ensure that a Hindu becomes a better Hindu, a Muslim becomes a better Muslim, a Christian becomes a better Christian and so on. In fact, this spiritual basis inspires everyone to pursue his own religion better by putting into practice Love and Selflessness. That is why the Organisation features in its emblem the symbols of the major religions of mankind.

Thus, without any distinction of religion, nationality, race, socio-economic status, either for those who work in the Organisation or for those who are served by it, the Organisation transcends all barriers leading humanity towards the ideal of 'Fatherhood of God and Brotherhood of Man'.

Membership Fees

There is no fee or subscription for membership. The concept of fees or membership subscription is alien to the Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations, for there cannot be any fee or subscription for one's journey towards his own Self.

Units of the Organisation

The organisation functions through its primary units called as Samithis and Bhajan Mandalis of which individuals - from different strata of society, different ethnic groups pursuing different religions and faiths - are members who are bound by the dictum of "Love all, Serve All" and pursue their own sadhana towards self-realisation following the path of selfless service to humanity.

Every member of the Organisation is expected to undertake sadhana (spiritual discipline)andabidebythefollowing 9-point Code of Conduct which has been ordained by Sri Sathya Sai Baba for one's spiritualadvancement:

- 1. Daily meditation and prayer.
- 2. Devotionalsinging/prayerwithmembersofhisfamilyonceperweek.
- 3. ParticipationintheBalVikasprogrammesconductedbytheOrganisationforchildren.
- 4. Attendanceatleastoncepermonthas group devotional programmes conducted by the Organisation.
- 5. Participation in community service and other programmes of the Organisation.
- 6. Regular study of Sailiterature.
- 7. Puttingintopracticetheprinciplesof"ceilingondesires"andutiliseanysavingsthereby generated for the service ofmankind.
- 8. Speakingsoftlyandlovinglywitheveryonewithwhomhecomesintocontact. Nottoindulgeintalkingillofothersespeciallyintheirabsence.


Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations - Telangana

Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations was established at Mumbai in 1965 by the Divine Directions of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba Varu. It was also established in Andhra Pradesh and some other States at the same time. Uniquely, there were many Bhajana Mandalis functioning in Andhra Pradesh much before this.

Our Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations Telangana has been formed in 2017 after bifurcation of AP.

We have a great fortune of having "SIVAM"— in Hyderabad, which was constructed under the direct supervision of Bhagawan and inaugurated on 4th April 1973. This is serving as a spiritual center in the Heart of





Telangana-Hyderabad continuing the rich spiritual legacy of Sri Sathya Sai Prasanthi Nilayam, Puttaparthi.

Sivam is the epitome of unsullied auspiciousness. To state in humble terms Sivam is nota mere human creation; the Divine willed it to bless the humanity. From the very conception of the structure, the selection of the site, laying of the foundation stone, supervising the construction, to the inauguration of this architectural marvel – all aspects were directly ordained, orchestrated and executed by SWAMI in person.

The principal objectives of Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations are:

To help the individual –

- •To be aware of the Divinity that is inherent in him and to conduct himself accordingly.
- •To translate into practice in daily life, divine love and perfection; and therefore
- •To fill one's life with joy, harmony, beauty, grace, human excellence and lasting happiness.
- •To ensure that all human relations are governed by the principles of Sathya (Truth), Dharma (Right Conduct), Shanthi (Peace), Prema (Love) and Ahimsa (Non-violence).
- •To make devotees more sincere and dedicated in the practice of their respective religions by understanding properly the true spirit of their religion.

How are the Objectives attained?

The above-mentioned objectives are attained in the following manner:

- •By observing the four principles laid down by Bhagawan Baba, namely:
- There is only One religion, the religion of Love
- There is only One caste, the caste of Humanity
- There is only One language, the language of the Heart
- There is only One God, He is Omnipresent.
- •By constant remembrance of God and looking upon all creation as a manifestation of Divinity in different forms and shapes;
- •By underlining the essential unity of all religions and securing proper understanding of all religions as being based on Love;
- •By looking upon all work as service dedicated to the Divine;
- •By bringing to bear upon all life's problems, attitudes flowing from Divine Love, such as, understanding, compassion, tolerance, helpfulness, etc.
- •By basing all actions on Love of Divinity, fear of sin and steadfast observance of morality in society.
- •By engaging in spiritual, educational, and service activities, both at the individual and community level, in an organized, systematic manner, without expecting any material reward or appreciation, but solely to win God's Love and Grace.

Bhagawan himself headed the state of combined Andhra Pradesh between 1950-1971. With the Divine Grace & Blessings of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba, the following devotees have served

We have strong Youth force of around 3000 (Both Male and Female) rendering services in the activities connected to the Youth in above wings.

The largest district is Bhadradri – Kothagudem whereas Hyderabad is the smallest.

Telangana is the 29th state of India, formed on the 2nd of June 2014. The state has an area of 1,12,077 Sq. Km. and has a population of 3,50,03,674. The Telangana region was part of the Hyderabad state from Sept 17th, 1948 to Nov 1st 1956, until it was merged with Andhra state to form the Andhra Pradesh state. After decades of movement for a separate State, Telangana was created by passing the AP State Reorganization Bill in both houses of Parliament. Telangana is surrounded by Maharashtra and Chhattisgarh in the North, Karnataka in the West and Andhra Pradesh in the South and East directions.

Telangana is the youngest state in Union of India. However, as an economic, social, cultural, and historical entity it has a glorious history of at least two thousand five hundred years or more. Megalithic stone structures like cairns, cists, dolmens and menhirs found in several districts of Telangana show that there were human habitations in this part of the country thousands of years ago. Remnants of iron ore smelting found at many places demonstrate the hoary roots of artisanship and tool making in Telangana for at least two thousand years. The reference to Asmaka Janapada, part of present Telangana, as one of the 16 Janapadas in ancient India proves that there existed an advanced stage of society.

One of the first five disciples of the Buddha, Kondanna is a typical name from Telangana and though there is no exact information about his native place, the earliest known Buddhist township of Kondapur in Medak district is believed to be after him. The Buddha himself famously acknowledged that it was Kondanna who understood him properly. The Buddhist sources say that Bavari, a Brahmin from Badanakurti in Karimnagar sent his disciples to all the way to north India to learn Buddhism and spread the message in this region. Megasthenes, who visited India in the 4th century BCE, wrote that there were 30 fortified towns of Andhras and most of them were in Telangana. In the historical age, Telangana had given rise to mighty empires and kingdoms like the Satavahanas, Vakatakas, Ikshvakus, Vishnukundins, Chalukyas, Kakatiyas, Qutb Shahis and Asif Jahis.



CHAPTER 4 - SRI SATHYA SAI SEVA ORGANISATIONS TELANGANA – 3 WINGS OF THE ORGANISATION

The Wings of the Organisation:

Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations functions under three wings viz. (i) Spiritual, (ii) Education and (iii) Service. These symbolise Worship, Wisdom and Work, respectively.

Although the nature of activities undertaken under different wings appear to be distinct or dissimilar, yet there is an inherent interrelationship amongst all the three wings. Spirituality and Service are complementary to each other. Spirituality is the motivational force behind service and service is the fulfilment of spirituality.

Therefore, spiritual knowledge must be skilled into wisdom and should be put into practice in the form of service to humanity to realise the ultimate objective for which the organisation has been established.

Thus, to successfully realise the purpose of joining the Sai Organisation, one must participate in activities of all the three wings.

Spiritual Wing:

All the activities in Spiritual wing are primarily aimed at self-transformation and ultimately with an aim of leading to Self realization. Individual Sadhana is given utmost importance.

Some of the major events focused upon, in addition to regular activities, are

- 1. **Sri Sathya Sai Vahini Swadhyayam**, an initiative from SSSSO, India is being taken up as envisaged by the NATIONAL SPIRITUAL TEAM in Telangana state with a stipulated time frame to complete all Vahinis before 2025 October. Already parayana of FOURTH vahini is in progress and the fifth would be taken up on TELUGU NEW YEAR DAY which is on 13th APRIL 2021.
- 2. Lock down time has been utilized positively with **online Bhajans**, **Satsangs**, Likhitha Nama Japam etc
- 3. Online 'Sri Sathya Sai Vratams' have been conducted statewide on 3rd December 2020 on auspicious Karthika thadiya, the birth day of Bhagawan as per telugu calender where in more than 3000 families participated with devotion and love.
- 4. Mass chantings of **Gayatri and Sai Gayatri mantra**: The same is continuously taken up on a regular basis. As part of a national intiative, regular chanting of **Sai Gayatri and Samastha Lokah Sukhino Bhavanthu**i.e. viswa shanti matra was taken up daily from 9 pm to 9:15 pm.
- 5. Paaryana of **TAPOVANAM**, **SATCHARITHRA** of our beloved Bhagawanhas been taken up bythousands of devotees across the state and is continually in progress
- 6. Planting of auspicious **Vata Vruksha sapplings** at all important locations like Sri Sathya Sai Schools, Sri Sathya Sai Seva Samithis,etc received from Prasanthi Nilayam

- 7. Conducting **Sadhana Camps** once in six months in every district &**Study circles** once in a month in every Samithi
- 8. **Vedam workshops**(**SSS Samayak Sruti Sreni**) and 14 bhajan training workshops have been conducted. Subscription of Sanathana Sarathi encouraged in all districts
- 9. Sai Paduka pooja and Sai Ashtotharam have been performed as a mass activities in most of the districts.

Education Wing

The Education wing undertakes the following activities:

- (i)Sri Sathya Sai Bal Vikas Course for children up to the age of 15 years
- (ii)Courses for youth in the fields of Human Values, Indian Culture and Spirituality and other spiritual topics
- (iii)Parenting program: In accordance with the teachings of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba, value-based parenting is aimed towards educating young parents

By Divine grace of our Beloved Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba, we had a mixed year with both online and offline Bal Vikas sessions. Before Covid, we had good expansion of Bal Vikas in rural schools as part of the GSMY activities. In both the villages identified by every Samithi, BV gurus visited those villages every Sunday for taking Bal Vikasclasses. Later part, multiple centers had started internet-based learning for both Bal Vikas children and Bal Vikas Gurus. This online learning has really enabled Children and Gurus to directly connect and learn from subject matter experts.





Apart from regular Bal Vikas classes at local centers, we could plan and focus on three specific learning areas, run centrally by the state team for the benefit of gurus and children across the state:

- 1. Group 3 training to gurus.
- 2. Bhajan trainings to Bal Vikas children.
- 3. Vedam training with the help of Telangana State Vedam team.

We saw an increase in online Bal Vikas classes, as many schools were closed. However, Gurus are in touch with schools and schools are also eager to start Bal Vikas classes once schools reopen. Telangana state Bal Vikas team planned and executed online trainings for Gurus on Group 3 topics.

We wanted to make use of this lull period to make sure that gurus are well prepared on Group 2 and 3 topics. As part of this online training program, more than 150 gurus from across the state have participated in 12 sessions covering topics such as Bhaja Govindam, Harmony of Faiths, Management of



Thought...etc. This has helped Gurus learn from each other and share audio recordings of their learnings.

Similar activity for learning of Vedam chanting for gurus was done with the help from State Vedam team. Bhajan training, along with Kanjira, was taken up on every Sunday (online sessions) with expert bhajan singers.

Children identified from both rural and urban centers participated in this event and this has helped in identifying and grooming talent in local bhajan centers. After bhajans, prayers to Hanuman, popular deity among children, was taught by teaching chanting of Hanuman chalisa.

All these sessions set up by state team were on top of regular weekly Bal Vikas classes at all centers.



Prevailing pandemic conditions did initially hinder Bal Vikas activities at rural residential centers and school Bal Vikas. But urban Bal Vikas centers with good access to Internet have done extremely well as children had all the time to attend and focus on Bal Vikas.

Though it took some time, even rural centers could participate in online classes over smartphones and continuity of the classes is maintained.

Overall quantity has not increased this year for known reasons, but quality has increased and hope to make use of these additional learning means going forward.







Service Wing

Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba professed, "Service is the life breath of the Sathya Sai Seva Organisation. Remember the truth that you are born to serve society."

The Service wing undertakes service activities with a view to serve the society, more particularly, the lesser privileged in the society. Such service activities apparently seem to benefit merely the recipients of the service on a worldly plane.

However, on a spiritual plane, it benefits those who render such service as it helps them in their spiritual elevation towards attainment of self-realisation. Service activities that the organisation primarily engages in are:

- (i) Narayan seva-Nitya Anna Seva and regular Narayana Seva
- (ii) Medical camps-Mobile, Clinics and Telemedicine Services
- (iii) Veterinary camps, Goshala visits
- (iv) Educational assistance-Skill Development, Free Tuitions
- (v) Vocational training-Training in different Industrial Trades
- (vi) Visit to Hospitals and Services-Cleaning and distribution of Food and clothes based on the need
- (vii) Visit to old age homes-Spititual Activities and Services needed for the elderly
- (viii) Visit to Orphanages -Health and Hygiene Services
- (ix) Visit leprosy colony or hospital-Medical and providing Basic amenities
- (x) GramSeva (service in villages)-Grama Seva Maha Yagna in SSSSO-Telangana
- (xi) Providing relief during natural calamities, pandemics, or accidents. -Disaster Management and Relief
- (xii) Sri Sathya Sai Prashanthi Nilayam Seva
- (xiii) Tribal Services Sai Janani Comprehensive development for Tribal hamlets

All the information connected with above services have been discussed in detail individually. Our state has a dedicated Sevadal team of around 6000 members and youth force of 3000 with blessings of Bhagawan.



CHAPTER – 6: SRI SATHYA SAI TRIBAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Launched in Telangana state under the title: SAI JANANI

Summary

Integrated Tribal Development program was initiated way back in 2013 in Telangana at Chennaram cluster of Nagarkurnool dt.

There after the project got re designated under the title SAI JANANI, and extended in various quarters of Telangana state in 2018.

So far till Jan 2021, 82 health camps were conducted in Chennaram cluster, which is coming under ITDA Mannanur, catering to the medical needs of more than 25,000 patients coming from 40 villages in the tribal belt of Nagarkurnooldistrict.

Nearly 2040 patients were given Spectacles, 840 patients got operated for Cataract , 180 got their Dental problems cleared and nearly 2600 patients underwent bloodtests. 325 General surgeries were conducted so far. In other tribalareaslike Sai Janani -2Bhadrachalam, -3 Utnoor & -4th at Eturnagaram various developmental & spiritual activities like Bal Vikas, Medicare,Socio care , Sri Sathya SaiVratams,Bhajans,Narayanseva& Covid-19 services have been organize.

1. Chennaram Base camp , Nagarkurnool

People living in tribal communities cannot make it to hospitals because they cannot leave work, or do not have the financial resources to reach there or are too old to travel. To provide medical relief, SSSSO TS organizes quality medicare with diagnostic facility at the doorstep, once in a month. These teams visit tribal people in their homes and provide free medical assistance.

All of those patients who require advanced Medical & or Surgical interventions are guided to Super Specialty hospitals within the district or at Hyderabad. Follow up cases are taken up by well experienced sevadal.

Sri Sathya Sai National Drinking Water Mission in Rural India: Exponentially High Economic and Social Benefits

With 5.4 crore expenditure for 108 water purification plants, the Mission demonstrates a 10x economic benefit annually, and 136x benefit over the lifecycle of the Water Purification Plants




Even as the country is grappling with COVID-19, temperatures are rising, and summer is bearingdownonus. As predictable as the rising temperatures, are thewaterwoes inmuch of the country. Both urban and rural areas will once again experience the annual water shortages. In rural areas especially, women will have to trudge long distances to fetch clean water for drinking and other domestic purposes. Contamination of available groundwater with various chemicals, minerals and other pollutants makes it even more daunting to access clean drinking water every day. It is estimated that about 177 districts in 21 states across the country suffer from excessive fluoride in the available water supply, impacting more than 6.2 crore people. Other contaminants include nitrates, arsenic and other heavy metals.

Thankfully, residents of 108 villages across six states are saved from having to consume andcope with such contaminated water due to the installation of water purification plants in their villages. Over the last 14 years, the Sri Sathya Sai National Drinking Water Mission has installed 108 water purification systems in as many villages spanning the six states of Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Odisha, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, and Gujarat.

With the first plant installed in 2006, the Mission has over the years enabled uninterrupted supply of pure drinking water to over 40,000 families (over 2,00,000 users) in areas of chronic water distress. Most of the installations are in AndhraPradesh (68) and Telangana (24).

Fluoride contamination of drinking water is extremely high in several districts of these states leading to extreme burden on health of the residents. The design, planning and implementation of the Systems was carried out by the Sathya Sai Technology Group under the aegis of the Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations and supported by the Sri Sathya Sai Central Trust, Puttaparthi.

Sri Sathya Sai Technology Team's mission has been to 'reach out to the remote andfar-off rural locations and provide simple and affordable techno solutions to some of the long- standing problems faced by them'. With these objectives, the Sri Sathya Sai National Drinking Water Mission was born. Based on extensive research, the Technology team concluded that a Reverse Osmosis (RO) system is more efficient in eliminating toxins to the desired levels. Retaining essential minerals during the process can be done by controlling feed pressures and flow rates. So, the RO system has been the chosen method in the 108 installations acrossstates.




Image1: Filtration Process Used at the Water Purification Plants – Design

The Water Purification Systems are designed to cater to the needs of approximately 2,000 residents on a daily basis. This would involve purifying water at the rate of 1,000litresper hour, resulting in 10,000 litres of pure drinking water per day (at a rate of 5 litres per person). This assumes that electricity is available for ten hours per day to run the plant. The plant and equipment including electrical and civil works costs about ₹ 5 lakhs. Maintenance costs amount to approximately₹450perday. This includes operator's salary, electricity charges and, replacement of cartridges, membranes and other paraphernalia involved in the ROsystem.

The design of the Water Purification System ensures that the plant has to be self- sustainable. Each household in the village that opts to use water from the purification plant is given a membership card and a jerrycan/container. The membership card can be topped up each month for ₹ 60. This amount provides 20 litres of water per day for a nominalcostof₹2 resulting in a cost of just10 paise per litre If at least 80 to 90percent of the village signsup for the service,the system is able to generate enough resources to pay for the costs of running the plant, as well as some money saved as a welfare fund to serve the needy in the villages and when required. The Technology Team reports that in some villages, the welfare fund has accumulated a few lakh rupees.

This self-sustaining, self-funding model has resulted in smooth running of the Water Purification Systems since funds to pay the electricity bills, spare parts and operator salaries are available from the user fee deposits. There is no external funding required to keep the plants running. Villagers are also aware that the user fees are important to keep the plant operational.

The Technology Team helps with the setting up of a village committee. The village committee is solely responsible for the operation, maintenance and financial record keeping of the Water Purification System. The committee comprises of women, two women and youth members, and are chosen by the villagers themselves. Abank account is opened with the village name / committee name. A person from the village is employed to take care of the complete operations of the plant on a day-to-daybasis.

Key Takeaways and Learning's

Community participation in managing water sources is critical to its success. The plants have been running uninterrupted since they started operations. Sustained management of the resource involves complete buy-in from the community, management by the users / stakeholders through a village committee, and a self-sustaining financial model.

Cost-Benefit Analysis

Basedonwagedatafortheregion, costofwater, and health care, if purified drinking water was not available through the water purification plant, the coping costs incurred by members of the 40,000 households in 108 villages would be to the tune of ₹49 crores annually! For a one-time investment of ₹5.4 crores by the Sathya Sai Organisations therefore, annually the citizens in these villages avoid incurring losses of ₹49 crores as measured along the parameters mentioned below:

A whopping 77 percent of the annual ₹49 crores coping costs is due to potential losses inwomen's wages.

This includes:

- Loss of wages due to waterborne illnesses (own): 6.9 crores(14%)
- Loss of wages due to caregiving for other family members' waterborne illnesses: 15.6 crores (32%) and,
- Workdays lost due to water fetching duties: 15.6 crores(32%).

The rest of the losses are due to:

- Men's loss of wages due to waterborne illnesses: 3.5 crores(7%)
- Household health care costs: 2.2 crores (4%) and,
- Cost of buying water (estimated for only 10% of the users): 5.5 crores(11%).

Each household pays only ₹720 annually to avail such enormous benefits! Overthe potential15-yearlifecycleofthe108waterpurificationsystems,thecopingcostsaverted are ₹738crores.

The self-sustaining model of Water Purification Systems set up by the Sri Sathya Sai National Drinking Water Mission in 108 villages is replicable and amenable to scale up in many more villages.

Sharing his vision for 2025, Sri Nimish Pandya, All India President, Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations, underscored the potential of such decentralised water purification projects in rural and tribal areas in benefitting lakhs of individuals who are deprived of access to pure and safe drinking water.

Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations propose to expand this project leading to the centenary year celebrations of Sri SathyaSaiBabain2025. Through this initiative, the Organisations will also be contributing significantly to India's efforts to achieve the **United Nations' Sustainable Development Goal number 6 (SDG-6):** availability and sustained management of water and sanitation for all by the year 2030.

- 1. Conducted 2 day DM program at Alwal in October 2020.
- 2.In December, 2019 using the good offices of the State Trust Convener, DM team Telangana had arranged advanced trainers training camp with Trainers from National Industrial Security Academy (NISA) for 5 days. In this 25 trainers from all the southern States as well as Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh participated.
- 3.Conducted Disaster Awareness training to three batches of 90 bank security personnel in Andhra Bank Apex college during Feb 2020.
- 4.On the request of Prasanthi Nilayam Ashram authorities, Practical training in Fire fighting (Basic and operation of extinguishers) was conducted for various institutions of PrasanthiNilayam during Feb 2020.
- 5.Conducted Emergency Evacuation Mock Drills in Book Trust, Indoor Stadium, Administrative Block of University, Super specialty Hospital & Archives building of the institutions of Prasanthi Nilayam from 11th to 14th March 2020.
- 6. During recent floods in Hyderabad on 14th& 15th October 2020, DM Team had conducted Rescue operations at Ramanthapur and Towlichowki simultaneously forming two teams. In this operation totally around 160 people were brought out safely from inundated areas.
- 7. During the pandemic period, the team members have participated in Community kitchens operated in respective Districts.
- 8. Team had participated in planning and execution of maintenance of Social distancing in Shivam Mandir including disinfection of the Mandir premisis.
- 9. Apart from the above, the DM team members are actively participating in all the programs of the organisation.
- 10. Due to the prevailing pandemic situation, conducted virtual training for trainers for intending trainers from Karimnagar, Warangal, Bhadradri Kothagudem & Mahabubnagar Districts.
- 11. At present there are 12 Gents and 2 Mahila trainers.

During the year 2019-2021, about 2.47 lakh patients were treated in Medical camps, clinics, follow up cases and Mobile Health Services in Telangana, costing roughly 3.16 **crores**.

202 Medical camps conducted in the Districts of Hyderabad, Medchel, Vikarabad, Ranga Reddy, Bhadradri, Nizamabad, Sanga Reddy, Bhupalapalli, Mahabubabad, Warangal Urban, Nagar Kurnool, Mahabubnagar, Jagityal, Karimnagar, Nirmal, and Mancheriyal. during the year 2019-2020 benefitting 1,40,060 patients. 793 doctors, 614 paramedical, 1855 sevadal members participated in the medical seva.

PREVENTIVE HOMEO MEDICINE FOR VIRAL AND DENGUE FEVERS

Viral fevers like Dengue have spread in entire Telangana and thousands of people are suffering. Preventive Homeo medicine for Dengue and other viral fevers is giving excellent results. Hence Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisation, Telangana approached the Deputy Director, Ayush, Ramanthapur, Hyderabad and obtained preventive homeo medicine.





The Preventive medicine has been sent to the District Presidents of Hyderabad, Secunderabad, Ranga Reddy, Medchel, Mancheriyal, Nirmal, Komaram Bheem Asifabad, Mehabubnagar, and Vikarabad. They distributed in colonies, schools, public places and in medical camps. Over one lakh people benefitted with the medicine.

Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Health Services in Telangana is a novel outreach programme, started in March 2011, at Nandi Wanaparthy village, by Hyderabad District. This project is being continued on the following Divine directions of our Beloved SWAMI on medical care:

- Medical care must be provided free of charge;
- Medical care must be administrated with love and care;
- •Every patient must be given the best available treatment and Finally "Treat the patient and not merely the Disease".

Keeping in mind the above Divine Directions, Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Health Services started its activities in 2011 at Hyderabad and now it has been serving in six districts of Telangana. Activity commencement details are as follows:

Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Health Services in Telangana, with a noble cause of taking healthcare to the rural doorsteps, rendering medical services every month, with its team of doctors and offering diagnostic services. The cases identified in the camps for further investigations, procedures, surgeries, will be sent to the nearby town/city hospitals and provide treatment to the patients totally at free of cost.

With the Divine Blessings of Bhagawan Sri Sri Sri Sathya Sai Baba varu, Sri Sathya Sai Mobile Health Services project has completed **NINE YEARS**of service to the poor and needy people.

These medical services include the Specialties viz. General Medicine, ENT, Ophthalmology, Dental, Obstetrics and Gynecology, Orthopedics, Pediatrics and Dermatology.

Service to Humanity with Love and Care Achievements during 2011 - 2020 (upto 31st December 2020)

1,56,251 patients from 4991 villages in 560 camps were treated with love and care; 2834 Doctors, with a minimum 6-8 doctors per camp are blessed with Seva Prasadam. They represent the Specialties of General Medicine, Obst. & Gynecology, Ophthalmology, Dentistry, Pediatrics, ENT, Cardiology, Orthopedic, Neurology.

26,517 Lab Tests, 1027ECGs were done in the mobile vans to diagnose intricate ailments and to monitor chronic diseases; 16,858 Ophthalmic cases, 3,827 cataract surgeries and 13,031 spectacles were given to the identified patients; 1,147 General procedures/Surgeries/biopsies, FNACs were done; 351 patients received cardiac investigations, procedures, surgeries.

2525 women with Gynecological problems were treated; 460 patients have undergone ENT check up/procedures/surgeries; 3101 patients have undergone dental treatment viz. extractions, fillings, scaling, partial dentures, full set dentures and dental fluoride stains removals.

HEALTH CARE PROJECT FOR NEWLY BORN CHILDERN

(Experiencing SAI in Service)

NEWBORN SCREENING FOR HEARING camp at Area Hospital, Vanasthalipuram, Ranga Reddy district, Telangana:

The Health Care project for newly born children is a new initiative taken up by SSSSO, TS in association with SAHI (Society to Aid hearing impaired) for the first time in India.

Hearing Impairment is a hidden disability in newborn children. Speech and language are interconnected with hearing. Late detection causes irreversible stunting of the speech and language development which further effects the future potential of the child. Detection of hearing impairment in infants within first six months of age is overly critical and has proven advantages over those detected later, terms in acquiring normal speech and language regardless of degree of hearing Impairment. Human brain developmental capacity with respect to hearing, speech and language development is maximum at the age of two years.

It is important to check and screen hearing for every neonate to rule out any audiological anomaly, to correct it at very young age and obtain maximum benefits which can help the child to lead a complete normal life in par with their age group children. With this concept the project is launched at Area Hospital, Vanasthalipuram, RR Dist on 2.10.19. It is twice in a month.



The project is inaugurated by Dr. Ramesh Kumar, Medical Superintendent, Area Hospital, Vanasthalipuram, and Dr. K. Ram Babu, MS (ENT), Apollo Hospital, Jubilee Hills, Hyderabad.Sri Srinivas, Chief Audiometry Department and State Medical Coordinator, Telangana participated.

Eleven camps conducted and 241 newly born children screened. Out of 241 infants 48 infants identified as hearing problem patients and requested them to come for further reviews and course of investigations at Apollo hospital. The above results clearly shows that 20% of newly born children are having hearing impairment. The percentage will increase in near future.

It is the high time to establish many more such screening centers started in all districts in Telangana during Centenary celebrations of our Beloved SWAMI.

CARING BEYOND CURING

Follow up cases

Hundreds of follow up cases come across in the medical camps. Some seem to be serious, and volunteers make note of them, arrange dates for further investigations/operation/treatment, bring the patients to Hyderabad city, accommodate them in local Sathya Sai centers and provide them with food and other necessities. A few of the patients are described below; many such cases have been taken up during the period.

SAI REHABILIATATION PROGRAM (SRP)

Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisation, Telangana is providing local volunteer doctors and dedicated sevadal in all districts for effective implementation of Sai Rehabilitation Program, after discharge of the patient from the hospital, to help heal the body, mind, and spirit of every patient. This noble service was launched in Andhra Pradesh and Telangana in January 2008.

There is a state level activity in charge for SRP and District SRP i/c in all Districts. Local devotee Doctors in the districts are providing voluntary service of free checkup of the patients.

Tele Medicine Seva

Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations-Telangana is rendering medical services since more than four decades conducting regular Medical camps in remote villages of Telangana, Clinics in the towns and cities and single doctor clinics at their Bhajan centers and follow up cases for necessary investigations, procedures and surgeries at towns and cities of Telangana. Mobile Medical vans are going to remote areas and rendering service to the tribal people.

Due to the Pandemic situation, the entire medical activity in the State stopped and due to this it is observed that many of our beneficiaries and others who need support especially in the rural and some urban areas are not able to venture out hospitals or clinics due to the fear of contracting COVID-19 disease. Sai Doctors in the organization have been receiving calls for help and medical advises for simple medical ailments.

Keeping in view of the requirements of medical support to our suffering people, Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organization, Telangana in association with Sri Sathya Sai Trust planned to launch Telemedicine services in Telangana.

After taking the consent from the All India President, SSSSO, it has been decided to start the Telemedicine services in Telangana in the areas of General Medicine, Pediatrics, Gynecology, ENT, Cardiology, Dentistry, Neurology, Orthopedic, Ophthalmology, Dermatology, Pulmonology, Gaestrology and Neonatology specialties. Telemedicine services are available twice in a week i.e. on Saturday and Sundays headed by Dr. K. Ram Babu, and District Medical Coordinator, Hyderabad a senior consultant, ENT, Apollo Hospital, Jubilee Hills, Hyderabad.

The software is provided by YouSee Sri Gunarajan and his team. A young group of 40 ITSai Sevadal were trained.

The Director, Vaidya VidhanParishad, Hyderabad and Commissioner, Public Health, Government of Telangana have been informed through SSS Trust. The entire telemedicine project is being run as per Telemedicine Practice guidelines of Indian Medical Council and NITI AAYOG guidelines issued in March 2020.

With the Blessings and Grace of Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba varu, Sri Sathya Sai PraanaMitra (a Telemedicine seva project) is launched in Shivam, Hyderabad at 10-45 a.m. on 29.8.20. Sri H.J. Dora, Convenor, State Trust, Sri Kailash Prasad, Member and others, SriP.Venkat Rao, State President, SSSSO, Telangana, Sri Gopi Krishna, Dr. K. Ram Babu, Program Coordinator, and State Medical Coordinator, have graced the occasion and launched the Tele calling process.

CHAPTER – 11: COVID – 19 RELIEF SERVICES

COMMUNIY KITCHENS

During the times of unprecedented Covid 19 crisis, Sri Sathya Sai Seva Organisations, Telangana had offered extensive services to the needy and poor through widespread community kitchens. Across the state 37 community kitchens were permitted spanning over 21 districts. A due validation process was followed with a thorough inspection of the facilities, safety measures and an objective assessment of the local resources.

The community kitchens were operated in 31 towns of 9 districts. A total of 6.5 lakh food packets were distributed till 31Aug 2020. This amounted to an average of 12000 meals per day for the entire 75-day period.

The meal was prepared as prasadam with reverence and was offered with love. Extensive planning and seamless integration with Police and Municipal Authorities allowed a hassle-free distribution across the towns. Community Kitchen operatedat Bowenpalli samithi, Malkajigiri - Medchal was the biggest in entire India serving 8000 meals per day.

The entire process was duly supported with devotion and dedication by Sri Sathya Sai youth and Sevadal. The compliance for hygiene, safety and caution was well adhered to across the locations. Robust information systems were evolved to ensure a close monitoring and crisis management by the state teams.

This opportunity built a strong working force and a field team in these samithies involved. The organisational capabilities in planning, resource pooling was significantly enhanced. The organisation has also received innumerable accolades from the various quarters of the society for such massive scale of operations.

This crisis of human suffering on the contrary strengthened the inherent compassion in the human heart. The faith in the Lord was nurtured and significantly deepened through this unique experience. May Bhagawan bless us to be HIS worthy instruments.

AMRUTA KALASAMS (AK)

By the grace and blessings of Bhagawan, Sri Sathya Sai SevaOrganisation, Telangana could distribute 20036 AmrutaKalasham Kits to the needy till 31Aug 2020. All the Samithies also taken up the distribution food items/groceries in the form of AmruthaKalashams for the needy and poor who were able to cook at their homes.

Though this activity was spread across the district, it was sustained continuously across all the state of Telanagana. An Amruta Kalasam(AK) kit consisted mainly of Rice, Pulses, Atta & Floor, Cooking oil, Spices, Soap, Detergent, Sanitiser, hair oil and Vegetables. Items have been decided based on the food habits of the beneficiaries and need. On an average, items that could last for a fortnight were distributed across the Samithis.

The distribution was undertaken after a thorough investigation into the worthiness of the recipient. An objective criterion was evolved and a strict adherence to the process was maintained. Due care was taken during the distribution to adhere to the social distancing norms that were issued by the government and making the authorities distribute and avoiding the Sevadal distributing them as instructed at many places. This service is continuing based on the need in several samithies.

ManySamithis have observed the Sri Sathya Sai Aaradhana Diwas and Eswaramma Day of 2020 by distributing AmruthaKalashams to many needy people across the state with devotion. Amrita Kalashams allowed a wide spread participation by the devotees across samithis.

Voluntary contributions gathered right from the households to the shop keepers. This activity also allowed a significant bonhomie at the field level. Moreover since the distribution was done as an offering to the Lord, the response from various sections of the beneficiaries was extremely moving.

This activity allowed a ground level assessment and understanding of the needs of the forgotten sections of the society. Moreover, the quality of the items distributed, the quantity, and the reverence with which these items were presented allowed a deeper integration of the beneficiaries into Satya Sai fold.

CHAPTER – 12: SRI SATHYA SAI RVTC REPORT

1. Brief narration of RVTC/VTC activity in the state.

Vocational training has been in place since 1980's in Telangana & State youth (Mahila & Gents) have played a key role in empowering rural India through various skill development programs.

RVTC gained much importance as a tool for valuebased skills training since 2000. Currently 18 centers are facilitated with i5 generation computers having Audio facility to take up Soft Skills training program with English Language skills. Alternate batches with 45-60 days training program (12 to 15 Ladies / Gents perbatch) are planned for the future starting from January 2021. In a calendar year 2 batches of Ladies &2/3 batches of Gents will avail the training facility.

Apart from Soft skills, regular training programs for 25ladies in Tailoring , Maggam , Beautician, Mehendi involving mahila's between 20 to 45yrs of age are also in place (3 batches / Center /Yr). Special training program for rural mahila's in preparing Sai Protein, Balanced diet, Women & Child Care in view of pandemic situations are also planned.

In district HQ's special training programs to address the manpower requirements as Bed side / Health Care assistant are also thought of.Electrical works, Plumbing, Repair of Pump sets, Home appliances and Agricultural implements are also planned for youth in Tribal belts of Telangana. Each vocational trainee will gain hands on experience apart from language & soft skills for 5hrs/ day, during 45 to 60 days training, ensuring a minimum of 200 contact hours.

Trainees will be encouraged to apply for MUDRA loans with a orientation on the Banking procedures, during the last week of the training program.



CHAPTER – 13 : PLANTATION OF DHYANA VRUKSHA SAPLINGS

"AUM SRI SAI SADHAKANUGRAHA VATAVRUKSHA PRATISTHA PAKAYA NAMAH"


Every Act of the Avatar is predetermined with the goal fixed and unshakable. Our loving Lord Bhagawan Sri Sathya Sai Baba took a small step in the year 1959 on 29th of June, planting a Banyan sapling on the hilltop placing underneath a Yantra created by Him from thin air.

This grew into a massive meditation tree giving solace to numerous Sadhakas in the past years and continue to help devotees connecting Swami even today. But this was not just the end of His Leela as we see things unfolding in a miraculous way whereby by around 5000 saplings made out of the sacred tree are going to be planted in the nook and corner of the world.

These saplings in turn will grow into vast meditation trees in the future and will stand as a testimony to the Divine Legacy of the Avatar. It is in this context that we are to prepare ourselves for the dawn of a new era and plant the saplings in various centers /locations of our states with utmost devotion and care.

The following points may be looked into while undertaking this seva to maintain the sanctity and uniformity.

- 1. The plants should be carried from the Prasanthi authorities in a ceremonial manner with collective chanting of Sai Gayatri.
- 2.It was advised by the All India President, to carry the saplings from PrasanthiNilayam before the 95th Birthday of Bhagavan Sri Sathya Sai Baba so as to plant them as part of 95th Birthday Celebrations.
- 3. While placing indent for the saplings care should be taken to ensure that the place of plantation is located in our centre precincts, the property is not encroached one or subject to eviction by the authorities in future, the place is serene and not a crowded one Etc.
- 4. The devotees of our states should be encouraged to do Likhita Japam with added vigour. These books will be placed under the saplings in a big pit.
- 5.An auspicious date and time should be decided in advance for the plantation ceremony uniformly across the state.
- 6.A small Homam may be organized with the Sai Gayatri chanted by the devotees continuously.
- 7.A name plate 2'x1' made up of tin should be prepared with the name 'DHYANA VRUKSHA' and be dug near the tree.
- 8. The LikhitaJapam books should be bound in a red cloth of 20 books each in one cover and the bundles should be placed neatly in the pit amidst chant of Sai Gayatri

9. Vibhuti, Turmeric, Kumkum Etc. should be spread over those books. Then the pit should be covered.

- 10.Similarly with Bhajan and chanting going on the saplings should be brought from the sanctum sanctorum and be planted putting Vibhuti and sprinkling water on them.
- 11. Proper arrangement must be made to save the sapling from cows and goats.
- 12.One responsible devotee should be in charge of taking care of the sapling.
- 13.Once the sapling grows into a sizeable tree, a circular 'mandapam' may be made to enable the devotees to sit comfortably and do Dhyana.
- 14. The State Organisation will keep a record of all the trees planted at different locations and monitor their growth.

CHAPTER – 14: SRI SATHYA SAI VEDADHYANAM

With the Divine grace of Swami, the TS Vedam team was blessed to carry out the following activities during the COVID period under Spiritual Wing of our State.

1. **Vedam Training** for about 5 batches of Bala Vikas Teachers over a period of 4 months since Mar'2020. About three classes per week were conducted and the vedic chants from the national Vedam syllabus were taught. During the other days practice sessions were conducted by the district Bala Vikas coordinators so that the learning will be more robust and at a faster pace. Vedam team had an opportunity to train about 75 Bala Vikas Gurus by swami's grace and look forward for more such sessions

2. National Online Veda training Sessions – Sri Sathya Sai Samyukta Sruthi Sreni

For the first time across SSSSO formal Vedam sessions were planned for the youth across the nation Online registrations were taken. About five thousand enthusists across the country got registered. TS state was blessed to have the third highest registrations across states with about 250 registrations. These participants were divided into batches of nine members, About 15 batches for ladies and about 12 batches of gents were formed.

About 13 vedam trainers cum resource persons got selected by the national core team for training these participants from the state. These trainers were given awareness sessions on vedic Sanskrit, grammar along with the nuances of teaching and conducting Vedam classes.

As a state team we were blessed to have the State Vedam coordinator and two other resource persons participate in the core team responsible for preparing the Training manuals for the trainers and the learners. Weekly twice training classes are being conducted without break since 2020 gurpurnima. Sri.Krutiventi Anil Kumar, Sri Chakradhar, Sri Harinath, Sri, Krishna Dinesh, Sri Sethuraman, Sri Vishnu Sudheer are rendering services from gents side . Smt. Palepu Sailaja, Smt Saraswati Charan, Smt Lakshmi Kantam, Smt Surekha, Smt Swethi Basutkar, are rendering services on the Mahila's Side.

About 100 participants from these have completed the first level of training and now learning the second level of vedic hymns. By sheer grace of Bhagawan, from these about 20-25 members are likely to become trainers with swami's grace and this will double the current certified trainers' team in the state

- 3. Parallel to the Srutisreni classes there are also satsang sessions conducted once a month exclusively on the Vedic literature based topics under the Gama-Agama series. Members of the State Vedam team is blessed by having the opportunity to participate in this as speakers and as coordinators for this program by swami's grace
- 4. Owing to the regional influence of the dialectical based language pronunciations there is a continuous challenge for the learners and chanters to master and pronounce the vedic hymns in correct manner. To help the chanters and learners overcome this with swami's grace the state Vedam team was able to start daily online Vedam classes from 16 Nov'2020. About 500 enthusistic participants got registered for these daily classes at state level over and above the training under the national scheme. The love for following swami's command was so visible and heartening in the process when we had registration of people from six years to eighty years.
- 5. Learners are classified into 4 age groups under 18 years, 18 to 35 years age group, 36-50 years age group and above 50 years age group. About three teaching sessions and two practice sessions are being conducted by swami's grace since 16 Nov 2020.

- 6. Sri V.Sri Gaytri Sharma, Sri Adarsh, Sri Nanda Kumar, Sri Vyomakesh, Smt Uma Maheswari, Smt Vasavi, Smt T Padma, Smt Madhavilatha, Smt Bandhavi, Smt Sobha are rendering their services at the divine lotus feet of swami. Skilling aspects of chanting are being focussed in these classes from basics so that the learners can pick up the art of chanting vedic hymns in a correct manner.
- 7. It is heartening to have participants from Germany, and America for these classes. About 150 Participants have successfully completed the level one and now learning level two hymns from the national Vedam syllabus. Again from these about 25 members are likely to be of trainer grade. With swami's grace this will again add up to the certified state Vedam trainers number to about 60-70 by next year from the 10 members when these activites were started
- 8. As part of veda poshana activities across all active samiti's all over the state Vedam chanting has become a necessary and compulsory activity and prerequisite before daily and weekly bhajans. With the help of spiritual coordinators this practice is planned to be taken to other samitis as well by providing the audio players and recordings of the vedic hymns
- 9. As part of Bhagawan's centenary celebrations across the TS state about 100 EkadasaRudrabhishekams along with Mahanyasam are planned and being conducted. These are being conducted since Dec'2020 uninterruptedly
- 10. About 8-10 districts are being identified which have a base of vedic chanting. For these districts District Vedam coordinators are identified and assigned so that the practice sessions for learners will happen continuously to facilitate the learning of vedic hymns all through the year. This will continue till the birth centenary celebrations with focus so that across all districts we will have a Vedam chanters team for each district and from there it will be propagated and sustained with grace of Bhagawan.
- 11. The planting of the Vatavriksha saplings(Dhyana Vriksha) which were obtained from puttaparthi was taken up across the districts. State Vedam team was blessed to participate in these and guide the same by way of facilitating the sai gayatri homams and other rituals as part of this sacred activity
- 12. In the village of Wyra, Khammam district the soft launch of Sri Sathya Sai Veda Sastra Pathashala was performed with pure grace of swami. About 25 students were identified . these students are being given training in basic Bala Vikas and Sri Sathya Sai Education till the completion of Moddham after which the formal syllabus of Vedam will be taught inline with the Sandeepani National Vedic University norms. Efforts are being made with swami's grace to teach the students Computer programming and Vedic maths apart from the academic and vedic syllabii. Sri Samba Murthy garu and sri Sudhakar garu are actively involved in this service and offering their yeoman service at Bhagawan's lotus feet.
